


## NOTIFICATION TO ABUTTERS

Under the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act  
And  
Belchertown Wetlands Protection Bylaw

In accordance with the second paragraph of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 131, Section 40, you are hereby notified of the following:

- A. A Notice of Intent has been filed with the Belchertown Conservation Commission under the Wetlands Protection Act (General Laws Chapter 131, Section 40), proposing to: install a roadway, drainage and utilities through the former Belchertown State School campus connecting Front St. and Jackson St.
  - B. The address of the lot where the activity is proposed is: Jackson St. and State Street- property of the former Belchertown State School  
Map 243 Lot# 178, 178.02, 178.10, 178.12, 178.13, 178.14, & 56
  - C. The name of the applicant is Richard Henderson of MassDevelopment.

  - \* Notice of the public meeting, listing all hearings, including the date, time, And place, will be posted in the City Hall or Town Hall not less than forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting date.
